

KENTUCKY OUTLAWS.

PADUCAH, Ky., June 8—A band of robbers is committing many depredations just over the State line of Tennessee in the Hollow Rock section. A few nights since the gang, numbering ten men, went to the house of John Hall, in Camden, and called him from bed to open the store, representing that they desired to purchase a shroud for a dead man. After getting into the store they forced him at the point of a pistol, to open his safe and deliver up the contents, amounting to one-hundred and eighty dollars.

Last Friday night the band visited Vale, a station between this city and Hollow Rock, and, going to the residence of a brick manufacturer named Lee Francisco, demanded of him all his money. He refused at first, but was finally brought to terms, after being hacked across the face and hand with a knife. He delivered over all the money he possessed, amounting to \$207.

The night following, Camden was again visited, and the store of J. J. Style was robbed of \$75.

The same night Hollow Rock was visited by the robbers, and the store of Lovelace Bros. broken open and robbed of a lot of clothing and dress goods.

Sunday night a Sawyer, three miles from Hollow Rock, a lot of suspicious-looking characters came into the town. The citizens suspected them as being the authors of the numerous robberies in the vicinity, and accordingly armed themselves and forced the suspicious characters to leave, firing over fifty shots at them. It is not known whether any of the would-be robbers were injured or not. Those who claim to know say the band is somewhere in the Big Sandy bottoms.—The Republic.

PARIS, Tex., June 9.—On the 5th of June two boys about 11 years of age were playing marbles at the village of Johnsville, I. T. A dispute arose between them. Willie Barnett drew his knife and started at Pinkie Palmer. Palmer endeavored to escape, but was caught by Barnett, who drove his knife into Palmer's head, just back of the ear, causing instant death. Barnett was arrested and brought to jail here by Deputy Marshal Weaver this morning. Barnett is the youngest murderer on record here.—The Republic.
