A BRUTE.

Fiendish Attack on a Woman by an Italian in Portland.

SHE IS KICKED NEARLY TO DEATH.

After Which He Shoved Her Over an Embankment Eight Feet High. The Brute arrested.

PORTLAND, July 8.—A man giving the name of J. McDonald, who lives in the vicinity of Fourth and Baker streets, informed Detective Day this morning that an Italian had beaten and kicked a German woman until she was lying at the point of death in a little hovel in the gulch under the Fourth-street bridge.

Day immediately repaired to the scene after telephoning Dr. D. H. Rand the circumstances. Upon arriving on the scene the officer arrested Antonio Dantello and took him before the injured woman, who positively identified him as being her assailant. The Italian was accordingly taken to the city jail and locked up in a dark cell. A reporter called on him, but he either could not or would not talk the English language the latter being probably the case.

In the meantime, after examining the woman Dr. Rand and Secretary Walpole conveyed Mrs. Braun, who is Dantello's victim, to St. Vincent's hospital where she lies in a very precarious condition. The woman was in a very delicate condition when the assault occurred and it is hard to say how the case will result.

After beating her Dantello shoved her over an embankment, and being a large woman the fall of eight feet injured her severely. She had had several convulsions before the physician arrived, and was bruised considerably about the face and body. Her right side was greatly swollen, and black and blue.

Mrs. Braun and Dantello are squatters on the railroad land in the gulch in question, and heretofore procured their water from one spring. Becoming hoggish, the Italian boarded the spring up and refused to allow his neighbor to share it longer with him. It was in a dispute over the water rights that Mrs. Braun was assaulted. This occurred Tuesday, and Dantello was arrested yesterday on a charge of simple assault and battery, and Mrs. Braun being unable to appear, Justice Wood continued the case until to-morrow.

The police have not booked Dantello on any charge yet, as they wish to see the result of Mrs. Braun's injuries. At 2 o'clock this afternoon she was resting as easy as possible under the circumstances. —East Oregonian.

A Former Pinkerton Superintendent at Philadelphia Talks.

Riding in luxury.

LONDON, July 8.—A four in-hand, luxuriously and splendidly equipped, left Braemore, Aberdeenshire, this morning for Loch Rannoch, Perthshire. It contained Mr. and Mrs. Andrew Carnegie, Miss Whitfield and Mr. Armitage and they were on their way to one of the most charming spots in Scotland where they will make their summer headquarters. The party, it is said, will take opportunity to visit the scenes of the battlefield of Killiecrankie, which is but a short distance from Loch Rannoch. Mr. Carnegie seemed much brighter, under the influence of the bracing air and delightful highland scenery and had evidently overcome the agitation which affected him yesterday, but still refused to be interviewed and declined even to say whether he had any knowledge of the struggle and loss of life at Homestead.

Mount Etna very Active.

CATANIA, July 10.—The eruption of Mount Etna assumed alarming proportions during the night. Huge quantities of lava have been thrown out of the volcano and have formed a double stream which is advancing rapidly toward Nicolosi and Belpasso. The lava is already within six kilometers of Nicolosi. Great damage has been done to the surrounding country. A severe earthquake was felt in the immediate vicinity of the volcano during the night. To-day the populace of Nicolosi assembled outside the Cathedral and knelt on the ground in prayer, being afraid to enter on account of the continued shocks and subterranean rumblings, which are like the noise of a storm. Twelve houses and a portion of a church have been destroyed. The eruption is still active.

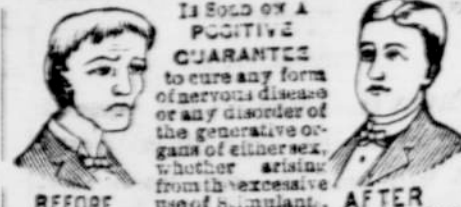

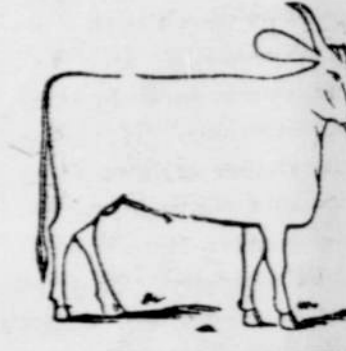
