Probably three or four hundred head can be bought from the ranchers, all good marketable beef steers.

RACE PROGRAM.

Over the Burns race course commencing October 13th:

First day, 13th:—Running race 1/4 mile dash, free for all. Purse \$125.

Second day, 14th:—Running race 600 yds free for Saddle Horses that never run for public money. Purse \$50.

Same day:—Trotting Race, 1 mile, free for all horses raised in Harney County, 2 in 3. Purse \$75.

Third day, 15th:—Running race, 1/2 mile dash, free for all. Purse \$150.

Fourth day, 17th:—600 yd dash free for all. Purse \$125.

Fifth day, 18th:—Running race, 1/2 mile heats, 2 in 3, free for all. Purse. \$200.

Sixth day, 19th:—Twenty five mile race, free for all, no one rider to run more than 5 horses in said race and each rider to change horses every mile and start from the score. Purse \$75.
