Proceedings of the County Court.

ROADS.

A change prayed for in the county road in Silvies valley granted by the court.
A road petitioned for to be known as the Anderson Valley and Juniper road. Geo. Stanciliff, Chas. Peterson and H. Layton were appointed by the court to view said road.

G. A. Wright, supervisor of that section of the county road leading across the divide between Harney Valley and Steneken water, was ordered by the court to repair the road across the divide, the county to expend a sum not to exceed \$80 in county warrants for said repairs.

Geo. Wright appointed supervisor of road district No. 11.
Commissioner R. R. Stz authorized by the county court to have a well sunk on the county road near Windy point for the benefit of the public.

A bridge ordered to be built across Steneken water on the county road leading from Harney to Drewsey John Olt was given the contract for building the bridge for the sum of \$200, the contractor to furnish all the material except 4288 feet of lumber. Commissioner Wm. Alnow to superintend the work.

In the matter of a bridge to span the west fork of Silvies river on the Lawen and Narrows county road the county clerk was authorized to publish the necessary notice for sealed proposals for building the bridge the county court to consider said bids on Monday the 10th day of Oct. 1892 at 2 o'clock p.m.

COUNTY TAXES.
