The Waving Rock in Buenos Ayres.

Among the most remarkable curiosities of South America—that land in which the wonders of nature have been so bounteously lavished—is the "waving rock" of Buenos Ayres.

This singular freak of nature, discovered upon Mt. Tandil, is a colossal rock whose solid contents measure more than fifteen hundred cubic meters and weighs about twenty-five thousand kilograms. In shape it is an irregular cone. This huge rock seems to be fixed and nicely balanced in its place by some magical center of gravity; and, at the same time, has a swinging or waving movement from east to west which may be brought about by the wind or by the hand of a single man. Whenever the wind blows from the south the rock begins to wave, rising and falling like the branches of great trees and thus presenting one of the most curious of the many strange phenomena of the South American Continent.

Feud in Mississippi.

St. Louis, Nov. 6.—A Meridian (Miss.) dispatch says that a bloody feud is now on in Kemper County. Some years ago Thomas Tolbert was convicted of criminal assault. He escaped from the penitentiary, was recaptured and escaped again. The Sheriff took steps to arrest him, and sent Deputies Spinks and Donald to do the work. Yesterday the deputies met Thomas and John Tolbert and were fired on. Spinks and Donald returned the fire killing John Tolbert. Thomas Tolbert escaped, but was chased by hounds and took refuge in his father's house, which the posse surrounded. A fight followed, and Thomas Cole, one of the posse, was killed, another party has gone to Tolbert's place, and more trouble is expected.

County Court Proceedings.

The county court was in session two days Thursday and Friday the 10th and 11th. Liquor license was granted Geo. A. Wright of Drewsey. Bond, of W. J. South road supervisor of road district No. 10 approved. The supervisors were ordered to open the Burns Blitzen road. The court granted the road known

In the Anderson Valley and Juniper road new viewers were appointed.

In the matter of the Island and Potter cove road H. B. Mace, J. M. Dalton and Claud Metcfe were appointed viewers to meet on the 21st inst. to view and survey said road.

Court adjourned to meet on Dec 5th.
