—At the adjourned school meeting held at the school house in Burns district last Monday afternoon, for the purpose of levying school tax etc., nothing was done in that direction, because of our limited knowledge concerning the amendment of the school law last winter regarding taxes, voting bonds for school purposes, etc. It was decided to meet again the first Monday in June, when it is hoped we shall be able to act intelligently. The committee appointed to investigate the books, accounts and receipts of J. C. Parker, deceased, reported that the books were in such condition that it was impossible to report accurately the disbursements of the funds collected, and their opinion was, from all the information they could gather, that the money was properly expended by the school clerk and advised the tax payers of said district to release the estate of J. C. Parker and his bondsmen from any and all liabilities likely to accrue. That part of the report of the committee referring to the board of directors as being in a great measure responsible for the perplexing state of affairs we certainly think a little unjust. In fact we do not think so, we know it is an injustice. It is, according to the school law, the duty of the district clerk to keep an accurate account of all monies paid in and the disbursement of the same and for what purposes. This record of the clerk is only examined by the board of trustees once a year, viz: At the annual meeting; it is not supposed, neither is it the duty of the board of directors to record every warrant issued by the school clerk and signed by them, because the school clerk keeps the record. And further, immediately after the death of the clerk the board did everything possible to get such information as would exonerate the deceased clerk, and while they were satisfied that J. C. Parker was an honest man and would not wilfully defraud the district to the amount of one farthing, still in the absence of the information required—and which the committee on their part as well as the board failed to obtain—the report at the annual school meeting had to be in conformity with the books and papers in the custody of the clerk. How it was possible for said committee to endeavor to place a stigma upon the board for something they were in no way responsible, we do not understand; we simply have to conclude, in the absence of any malignant feeling on their part, that the desire of the committee was to make a long report of the onerous duty performed by them and ending at the same point as that of the board of directors, that is, as regards any further light on the subject, put in that "fling" as the directors to fill up.

Ordinance No. 29.

Be it ordained by the town of Burns Harney County Oregon.

1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to tie a horse or horses upon the streets of Burns Harney County Oregon for a greater period of time than twelve hours.

2. Any person or persons violating the foregoing ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and fined in a sum not less than ten nor more than fifty dollars and it is hereby made the duty of the night watchman to see that the foregoing ordinance is complied with.

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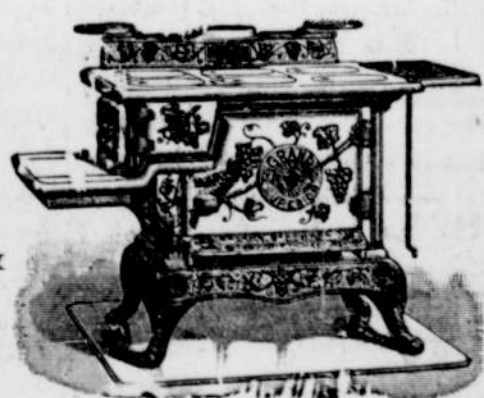
