An Interesting Land Case.

An interesting land case in Oregon has been brought before the Surveyor General Byars for decision. The trouble arose over the fact that the Malheur lake, in the southeastern portion of the state, which formerly covered an area of about 15,000 acres, went dry two or three years ago, except a long, narrow strip in the center, covering about a section. The cause of this was a channel force through a sand ridge between the lake and Harney lake which is lower, allowing the water to drain off into the latter. On the lands left by the recedence of the water some sixty persons have settled and are cultivating farms. It appears that a man named Nodine had acquired possession of all or nearly all the land around the margin of the lake, and he now claims that the "made lands," or the land left bare by the draining off of the water, accretes to him, and Surveyor General Byars has been instructed to have the land surveyed. He will have to make a ruling in the matter. This is only one of the many complications which have arisen from the habit lakes in that part of the state have of drying up or of becoming land at one season and water another.—East Oregonian.

A bill passed the last legislature to make counties liable for damages sustained in consequence of defective and dangerous country roads and bridges, but will not become a law until after the expiration of ninety days. It provides that whenever any individual while lawfully traveling upon any county road without contributory negligence on his part, and not having been warned of the defect or danger, sustains any loss, damage or injury in consequence of the defective and dangerous character of such road or bridge, shall be entitled to recover compensatory damages for such loss or damage from the county in which the damage occurred. Damages may be recovered by an action in the circuit court or in a justice court if the amount of damages sued for be less than \$1,000.

This law will be in effect in a short time, the proper authorities and road supervisors of our county had better be on their guard and look well to the condition of our roads a suit for damages if sustained will cost the county much more than it will take to have our roads in good repair.

The three McCarty brothers, Thomas, Billy and George, of Baker county, are supposed to have been implicated in the Roslyn bank robbery which occurred last September. Officers arrived in Baker a few days ago and arrested George McCarty, but when Sheriff Conde called at the house of William McCarty, near Haines, to arrest him, he was immediately covered by pistols in the hands of William and Thomas McCarty and made to remain quiet in the house until they secured horses and made their escape. A posse was immediately sent in pursuit, but the fleeing fugitives have not been captured.—Canyon City News.
