EDITOR EAST OREGON HERALD:—It is very seldom I obtrude my views upon the public, particularly of a political nature. And I now feel a diffidence in suggesting the subject of reform in an established party usage—as the democratic is the party of reform, why not give the people a trial of voting directly for their choice of candidates for the various offices of the county?

The Borden Trial.

NEW BEDFORD, MASS., June 13.—On the resumption of the Lizzie Borden trial this morning the cross-examination of Dr. Dolan continued; nothing of special interest was brought out, and he gave way to Dr. E. S. Wood, of Harvard medical college. He testified that there was no evidence in the stomachs of Mr. and Mrs. Borden that they had been poisoned. He found no blood on anything connected with the case, either instrument or clothing, except a small spot of blood on a white skirt, which was human blood, and probably came from the outside. 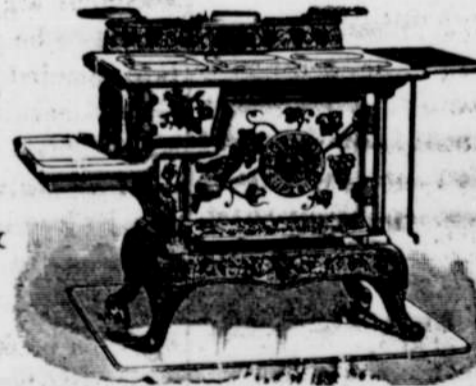
