

How It Was Obtained.—Last Friday, June 9, a license was issued by the county clerk for the marriage of Frederick Close and Maud Healey, of Harrisburg. The name of the witness as signed was Geo. Davis. At the time the clerk was requested to ask the papers not to publish the fact of the license for a couple of weeks. The couple were united in marriage by Justice George Howell the next day. It now transpires that the marriage was against the wishes of the parents of the bride, who is under 18 years of age, and that the affidavit that she was over 18 was sworn to by Edward Close, a brother of the groom under a fictitious name. A warrant was issued for his arrest, but he had fled, and could not be found. It is proposed to make an example of the case, which is not the first one of this nature to occur in Linn county.—Albany Democrat.

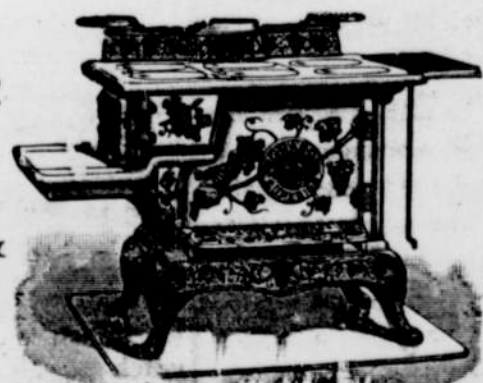
