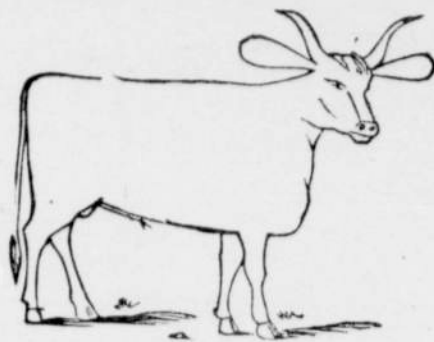

FROM THE OREGONIAN:
In Sunday's issue of the Daily Oregonian we find the following: "Harney county has an organization called the 101 Society, which has so thoroughly terrorized the community that it is impossible to secure a conviction when any of the members are brought to bay. The strongest evidence has no effect on the jury, and persons clearly guilty are acquitted in a very short space of time. District Atty. Hyde has many anonymous letters, presumably from this society, with pieces of rope six inches in length inclosed and stating that there will be a "neck tie party" if he insists upon trying to prosecute criminals in that county. Two years ago a man named Miller, an employe of the Lux & Miller cattle company, which owns 80,000 or a 100,000 acres of land and as many head of cattle in the eastern part of the state, was murdered for endeavoring to gain information about the doings of the society. He had heard that they intended to round up the company's cattle and to get some information he crawled under a house where the members were in session. A fit of coughing betrayed his presence and resulted in his death. The next day he was found in a fence corner with four bullets in his brain and as many more in his heart. The grand jury returned no bill of indictment, as no information could be secured. Three years ago Dave Shirk stood in his own door-way and shot a man, who was standing within 100 yards of his house. The body laid there three days in the hot sun, before any one dared to bury it. Shirk was indicted and tried by a jury largely composed of the 101 element and was acquitted in 15 minutes. The society is largely composed of land-grabbers and claim jumpers, who enter the inclosures of the large companies, put up shacks, kill the corporations cattle for food and defy everybody. They have been ejected and their buildings burned by the United States Marshall many times, but as soon as his back is turned they are again on the land. Companies and individuals like the Lux and Miller Company and Peter French own as much as 150,000 acres, and these squatters settle upon the land and take up 160 acres or more, and then add insult to injury by compelling the corporations to furnish them with beef."
We know not the author of this conglomeration of falsehoods, or his object. We presume the writer was in a lying mood and desired to give Charley Hyde a lift, and hold him up to the public as the great "I am" reformer and justice avenger of Eastern Oregon. The organization spoken of, did exist and we know that captain Waters defender of the settler element, Joe Woolley a settler and others received written orders signed by 101, to decamp immediately or "pull hemp," but it would seem this order came from the element the Oregonian writer is endeavoring to defend.
