

IN THE CREEK.

Folsom, March 2.—Mr. Messfore, who resides some eight miles east of Folsom, came to town this morning and reported finding the body of Isaac Bradwell in the creek near this place, dead.

Judging by the wheel marks of the buckboard, deceased had driven where they had run over the banks. He must have been thrown out, landing on his head and breaking his neck. Death has evidently been instantaneous.

Mr. Bradwell had resided in this vicinity for upwards of forty years, and was engaged in the chicken raising business on the ranch of Mrs. Milgate.

He came to Folsom yesterday to purchase provisions, and probably imbibed too much liquor, to which fault he was greatly addicted.

Coroner Clark has been notified and will hold an inquest on the remains.

As far as can be ascertained, Mr. Bradwell has no known relatives. He was a man of some 60 years of age.—The Bee.

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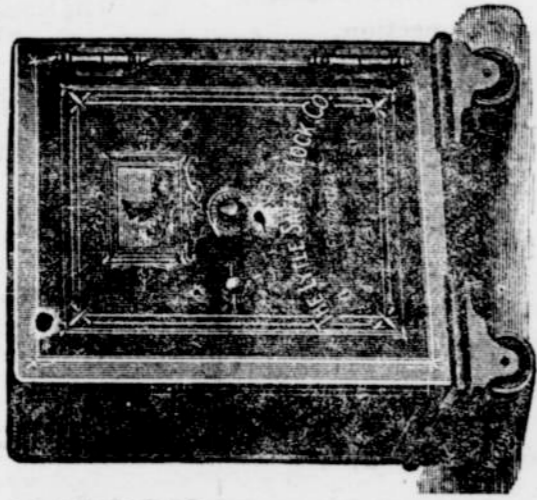
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
