**Murdered By Her Husband.**

ST. LOUIS, May 8.—Julia E. Gilson, proprietress of a furnished room house, was yesterday found dead at her home with her head almost completely severed from her body, and lying in a pool of blood surrounded by evidence of a frightful struggle. Near by was a large knife, with which the crime had evidently been committed. The last person seen with the woman was her divorced husband, William E. Glamott, and for him the police, on the discovery of the murder, began a search. They had a quarrel yesterday on a street-car, on which they met. Glamott called at the house, and it is supposed the quarrel was renewed.

ST. LOUIS, May 8.—William E. Wolgomott, who killed his divorced wife, Mrs. Judea Gilson, was found dead today in the room where he cut the woman's throat. He returned to the scene of the crime to commit suicide.
