Pullman, in addition to this, pays his employees merely nominal wages, and they bleed travelers for fancy tips. Every victim must pay 25 cents to \$1, or no favors are received, and the practice is part of the system. Everything about it is a cinch, and it is no wonder Pullman is a millionaire. Railroads are peculiarly public institutions, and the time is coming when laws will be passed that will muzzle them and their accessories and bring them to time.
