SILVER LAKE, Oreg., Oct. 10 '94. Ed. HERALD:—Our summers work is round up. We are through haying and threshing.

Several bands of beef cattle have been driven from here to the F. R. for delivery to contractors, and more are on the way and some parties are just getting ready to drive. Some bands of beef cattle sold at 4 cents to be delivered at Dorris Bridge.

The yield of grain here was good and we have an abundance of hay, so I guess there is no danger of starving here, notwithstanding the hard times

A man by the name of Geo. Walters, who has been in this country trapping for a few years, started for his home on Rogue River a few days ago, was found murdered about 35 miles west of here. He was found by some campers who stuck up a notice on a tree where to find the body, one of our neighbors passing saw the notice found the body and recognized it as that of Geo. Walters. He was shot through the head and it is thought he was killed for his money.

I see from the HERALD that the artesian well was both a success and failure that is, artesian water was found, but in consequence of accidents or mismanagement the flow is not satisfactory. Knowing something about the business myself, I feel certain that at a depth of 12 hundred feet a good flow can be struck. One man can see into the ground as far as another, yet there is a governing principle that controls the opinion of those accustomed to such work. It depends very much upon the water sheds surrounding a valley. My opinion is that artesian water can be found on the west side of Harney Valley than in any other part of the Valley.
