CONTINUED FROM LAST WEEK.

COUNTY CLERK'S REPORT.

Q-How much money has come into your hands for fees since the law requiring payment of the same to the county took effect?

A-\$256.50 to Oct. 21.

Q-What was the time that the contractor should have to complete the court house in?

A-Contract awarded to Geo. W. Young on the 15th day of February, 1894 and to be completed by Oct. 8, 1894.

Q-What was the contract about the building and finishing of the court house with the contractor?*

Q-How much has been received by you in the way of license in the last year?*

Q-What did the expediting of the county books cost, and who was employed as expert?

A-Thomas Jones, expert; amount paid by county \$475.

Q-How are the County Poor provided for, and by whom are they kept?

A-Price Withers contractor of County Poor at \$3.49 per capita per week.

Q-Was the county well dug by contract or not? And how much did it cost?

A-Let by contract to L. R. Mehahey, at \$2.20 per foot; 55 ft., \$121.

Q-How much has been spent on the artesian well, and from what fund was it paid?

A-\$4,243.22. Out of Road Fund.

Q-What is the amount of delinquent taxes outstanding, and for what years?

A-\$34,699.47 for the years 1885 to 1893 as per report of Thomas Jones, expert.

Q-What amount has been received by the county from the State road fund; and how much has been spent on roads in this county?

A-Amount received to road fund \$12,410.44. And there has been spent on county roads in said county \$5870.56.

COUNTY TREASURER'S REPORT.

Q-How much have you received from the County Clerk in the way of fees since the law requiring the same to be paid to the county took effect?

A-\$194.25.

Q-How much from the Sheriff?

A-Nothing.

Q-How much of the Road Fund have you on hand now?

A-\$2,665.79.

Q-How much of the Road Fund has been received by this county since, and including, the first apportionment by the State?

A-\$12,410.44.

Q-How much of said Fund has been spent, and for what purpose?

A-\$9,744.65 for roads, etc. See proceedings of county court for full particulars.

Q-What is the amount of the School Fund on hand?

A-\$769.85.

Q-What amount has been received in taxes for the year 1893?

A-\$27,080.04 from all sources.

Q-What amount delinquent for the same year?

A-My records do not show amount of delinquent taxes.

Q-What was the cost of the Artesian Well?

A-\$4,243.22, and was ordered paid out of Road Fund by county court.

Q-How much has been received by you in the way of License in the last year from various sources?

A-\$405.
