## The following change in the pres

 ent assesment laws were suggested and a committee of five sppoirted onsisting of Sterling, Greenleaf Wakefield, Parkgr and Yocum to act in conjunction with a commitlee apponted from the State Board of Equalization, to urge unon the coming legislature the importance of an improvement over our present 1st. As it r1st., As it requiers one or two years for the assessor to become proticient, the term should tended to four years.

We have no outside news the talk is entirely of the dead and injured, the citizens from far and near are helping to care for the suffering and condoling with those who lost friends. But it is better that we should t"rn our at tention to the busy world and try to forget our losses, a life of weep. ing will do the dead no good.
