HARNEY CITY, Or., Feb. 16— This place has not fully recovered from the effects of the removal of the county seat to Burns. The merchants and people generally have not lost faith in Harney, however, and the progress of the place will, when times improve, be far more encouraging than ever Harney is a supply point for a good district in Harney valley, and, as the country develops, will be one of the most pleasant places for residences in this section of Oregon.

Harney would make an ideal place for a college, (something which is needed) as it is the center of a large section without an institution higher than the district or common schools.

Their country has great cattle interests which demand transportation at seasons when it is almost impossible to get the stock to the railroad under the present conditions, which necessitate driving through a snowy country which is practically impassable for large droves of beef cattle.
