

County Court Proceeding.

Beginning March 6th 1895 and ending the 12th.

In the matter of the report A. S. Swain road supervisor of district No. 12 appr. Road district No 10 Wm. Altnow supervisor. It was ordered that the supervisor receive \$16.50 in addition to what he had been already allowed.

In the matter of the Chapman slough and Embree bridge road, the motion to strike out certain names on the petition of remonstrance, was sustained.

In the matter of road district No. 1 W. B. Johnson supervisor, the supervisor was allowed the sum of \$43.45.

The final report of Robert Drinkwater supervisor of district No. 6 a warrant was ordered in favor of the supervisor for the sum of \$54.90

In the matter of road district No. 9 J. P. Gearhart supervisor, continued for the term.

In the matter of the sheriff collecting delinquent taxes, it was ordered and adjudged that the sheriff be allowed to retain all costs and expenses incurred in making such collections, and to account to the county only for face value of the tax-roll.

In the matter of a petition for a road commencing near the slough house and extending near the mouth of Crane Creek on the eastern boundary line of the county. The petition granted and the following named persons appointed viewers; Samuel Mickel, J. P. Rector, and Albert Ward, T. A. McKinnon surveyor. The viewers to meet at R. L. Newmans on the 18th day of March 1895, at 10 o'clock a. m.

Bonds of supervisors of road districts Nos. 4, 6, 12, 11, 5, 2, 10, 13, 1, 3, 14, approved.

In the matter of the Narrows and Saddle Butte road, dismissed.

Resignation of P. L. Shideler Co. Ck accepted and Chas. E. Kenyon appointed to fill the unexpired term.

J. W. Miller appointed supervisor in road district No. 8. Bond of Chas. E. Kenyon examined and appr. by the court.

The report of Chris Dunnean road supervisor of district No. 14, appr. and the sum of \$9.56 allowed. J. O. Bunyard appointed supervisor of said road. The viewers on the extension of the Poison and Prater creeks road ordered to amend their report.

In the matter of the report of S. D. Webdell, supervisor of district No. 8 appr. and the sum of \$40 allowed.

Report of S. Lampshire supervisor of road district No. 3 appr. and the sum of \$15.4 allowed.

In the matter of the road petitioned for known as the Rock Ford and Diamond Valley road, the report of the viewers accepted and road ordered open.

The Chapman Slough and Embree Bridge road was ordered opened.

Bids ordered advertised to improve court house block and half the street surrounding.
