### SUMMONS.

In the Circuit Court, of the State of Oregon for Harney County.

PETER F. STENGER, Plff.  
vs  
ALAMEDA STENGER, Deft.

To Alameda Stenger, the above named defendant: In the name of the State of Oregon:

You are hereby summoned and required, to be and appear in the above entitled court, on or before the first day of the next regular term thereof, to wit, the 20th day of May 1895.

Then, there, therefore be you, and answer, or otherwise plead to plaintiff's complaint, in this suit filed against you, or for want thereof, the plaintiff will take a decree against you for the relief as prayed for in plaintiff's complaint.

1st: That the bonds of matrimony now existing between plaintiff and defendant be absolutely annulled, cancelled, and set aside, and a decree of divorce, absolute, be granted.

2nd: That plaintiff by said decree, be awarded the care, custody and control, of each, and all of the children mentioned in the complaint.

3rd: That the money and property taken by the defendant, as alleged in the complaint be decreed to be the entire interest of defendant, as alleged in the complaint be decreed to be the entire interest of defendant in lieu of dower, in all of the lands and property of the plaintiff herein, and of their joint and community property.

4th: That the land of the defendant and the land of the defendant and her three children jointly, mentioned in the complaint, be decreed to be for the use and benefit of the children mentioned in the complaint the issue of said marriage, and that the same be held in trust for them, by the plaintiff herein, and that defendant be decreed to have no right, title or interest therein, whatever, and that the decree herein, when made and entered, stand in lieu of a deed, for the purposes mentioned herein.

And lastly, for such other and further relief as to the court may seem just and equitable.
