AGRICULTURAL.

Where a single woman makes a homestead entry and subsequently marries, and thereafter lives with her husband (who had filed on an adjoining tract) in a house built across the dividing line between the two claims, by such residence abandons her own entry.

MINERAL.

In the selection of a newspaper for publication of notice of mineral application the Register, in the exercise of a proper discretion, may designate a paper that he regards best for the purpose of giving the greatest publicity to the notice, even although it may not be the paper nearest the land.

Mineral land so known will not pass under a townsit patent. Mineral land must be shown such as a present fact.
