Austria's aristocracy and officialdom are much startled by the announcement that Count Henry Counenhove, now representing Emperor Francis Joseph at the court of the Mikado, has married a Japanese lady of noble birth who, it is believed, was previously converted to the Roman Catholic faith.

This is the first time on record, says the Chicago Record, that a European Minister Plenipotentiary has ventured to marry an Asiatic, and the innovation is one which does not commend itself either to his Government or to his fellowdiplomats. It will probably result in the immediate withdrawal of! Count Coudenhove from his present post, since the new Countess is likely to be subjected to slights by the white races in the Orient, which might lead to serious complications it view of her rank.
