### CAUSED A DUEL.

Austria's aristocracy and officialdom are much startled by the announcement that Count Henry Coudenhove, now representing Emperor Francis Joseph at the court of the Mikado, has married a Japanese lady of noble birth who, it is believed, was previously converted to the Roman Catholic faith.

This is the first time on record, says the Chicago Record, that a European Minister Plenipotentiary has ventured to marry an Asiatic, and the innovation is one which does not commend itself either to his Government or to his fellow-diplomats. It will probably result in the immediate withdrawal of Count Coudenhove from his present post, since the new Countess is likely to be subjected to slights by the white races in the Orient, which might lead to serious complications in view of her rank.

The Coudenhoves are one of the most influential and ultra-Catholic families of the Austrian aristocracy, and the Count, who is now Envoy at Tokio, is closely related to the ex Prime Minister, Count Taaffe. Some years ago he achieved considerable notoriety in consequence of his having killed a brother officer, a Count Rosenberg, in a duel.

The quarrel originated in a dispute caused by the manner in which Count Coudenhove had helped his adversary to wine at a mess dinner. Instead of pouring the bottle forward to the left he had lazily bent it backward over his hand to the right for the purpose of filling Count Rosenberg's glass.

Everywhere on the continent of Europe, and especially among military men, this is considered as gross an insult as that offered by a Japanese samurai or nobleman when, in showing his sword blade to an acquaintance, he turns the sharp edge instead of the back toward him.—Call.

### Colorado Sheep War.

DENVER, June 5.—A special to the Times from Steamboat Springs, Colo., via Wolcott, Colo., June 5th, says: From early daylight horsemen armed with Winchesters have been galloping into town on the way to the seat of war in the Elk Head mountains. The main body left here at 10 o'clock this morning going via the Bear canon road. A wagon train follows the cavalry.

It is reported from Hahns Peak today by a freighter who came from Snake river, that the sheepmen have thrown 150 armed men into California park and entrenchments have been thrown up on the Bear river watershed. The information has caused high feeling among ranchers and strengthened their determination to keep the sheepmen from grazing their flocks upon Colorado ranges.—Statesman.
