Protection in China.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 7.—The United States anticipated Great Britain in taking the most energetic steps for the protection of the American missionaries in China. The injustice of criticisms that have been uttered in some quarters upon the alleged in difference of United States Minister Denby is fully shown by a mail dispatch that has just come to the state department from the minister. It is dated toward the close of June and shows that Minister Denby had made a sweeping and peremptory demand similar to that made yesterday by the British minister at Peking, for the fullest protection for all Americans living in China; for redress for the depredations committed upon their property and persons and finally for the capital punishment of the perpetrators.

Just what answer was returned by the Chinese government is not known as it has not yet reached the state department, but it is a fact that, so far as the recent outrages committed upon the missionaries in China, not one American was killed or injured, and, while some American mission property was destroyed, it will doubtless be promptly paid for. In view of the energetic course which Denby has already adopted, the state department it has not deemed it necessary

to send him further instructions for his guidance. He has already been authorized to confer freely with Admiral Carpenter, the commander of our naval force in Chinese waters, and the admiral in turn has been instructed by the secretary of the navy to lend all proper assistance for the protection of Americans.

Telegraphy Advanced.

Another great invention in telegraphy has been perfected and in a short time messages will be transmitted and printed in letter form at the rate of 350 words a minute. In speaking of the invention, an official of the Western Union Telegraph Company said a few days ago: "We have secured the invention which is the most advanced of anything that has yet been talked about in telegraphic service. We can send from New York to Chicago, in quadruplex over one wire and have the copy at each end produced upon a printed page, and not a printed slip, 350 words a minute. I say we can do this because we have done it. There is no delay about it. It is not a system liable to be obstructed by delicate and impossible mechanism. It is not a fancy or a fad which can produce a result in an electrical laboratory, but be of good service in a practical operation of daily life. The in-

vention is accomplished. It is practical. It will work. It is a practical printing telegraph which will give a result in page form like the page of a book. It is a thing that electrical inventors have been striving for since the early days of telegraphy. It is the Whitestone system very greatly modified and perfected so that a single wire can be worked both ways, and yield the result indicated. It will be some time before these machines can be put into practical operation, for a very few have as yet been made. They are still in the hands of inventors and constructors, but the scheme is perfected and the fact is accomplished."—Statesman.
