

A Good Law.

There is a provision in the Oregon statutes compelling people to take care of indigent relatives. We do not believe it is well understood, but it is there all the same.

Sec. 3944, Hill's code of Oregon: "Every poor person who shall be unable to earn a livelihood in consequence of bodily infirmity, idiocy, lunacy or other cause shall be supported by the father, mother, children, brothers and sisters of such poor persons, if they or either of them be of sufficient ability; and every person who shall fail to support his or her father, mother, child, sister or brother, when directed by the county court of the county where such poor persons may be found whether such relative resides in the county or not, shall forfeit and pay the county, for the use of the poor of their county, the sum of \$30 per month or such other sums as the court shall find sufficient, to be recovered in the name of the county court, for the use of the poor as aforesaid, before any justice of the peace or any court having jurisdiction; provided, that when any person becomes a pauper from intemperance or other bad conduct, he shall not be entitled to any support from any relative except parent and child."—L.A.

THE UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, Oregon, offers free tuition to all students. Young men can obtain board, lodging, heat and light in the dormitory for \$2.50 per week. Roomers furnish their own linen. Young women are provided with board in private families at \$3.00 per week. Young women desiring board should address Prof. John Straun, Eugene, Oregon; or Secretary Young Woman's Christian Association, Eugene. The University offers three baccalaureate degrees, Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science and Bachelor of Letters with corresponding courses of study. The following shorter courses are also offered:—An English course leading in two years to a business diploma and in three years to the title graduate in English; An advanced course for graduates of normal schools leading to the degree master of pedagogy; A three years' course in civil engineering leading to the degree civil engineer; A course of two years for teachers of physical education leading to a diploma and the title director of physical education. The University charges an incidental fee of ten dollars which is payable in advance by all students and by holders of diplomas from the public schools and those having teachers' certificates are admitted to the preparatory department without charge.
