
A Good Law.

There is a provision in the Oregon statutes compelling people to take care of indigent relatives. We do not believe it is well understood, but it is there all the same.

Sec. 3944, Hill's code of Oregon: "Every poor person who shall be unable to earn a livelihood in consequence of bodily infirmity, idiocv, lunacy or other cause shall be supported by the father, mother, children, brothers and sisters of such poor persons, if they or either of them be of sufficient ability; and COUNTY. and every person who shall fail to support his or her father, mother, child, sister or brother, hen directed by the c unty court of the county where such poor persons shall forfeit and pay the county, for the use of the poor of their coun tp, the sum of \$30 per month or the use of the poor as aforesaid, before any justice of the 4eace or any that when any person becomes a bad conduct, he shall not be enti tled to any support from any relative except parent and chine."-1.x
