WAR WITH SPAIN.

CAICAGO, Sept. 13 .- A special to a local paper from Washington says: Information as to the recent secret work in the navy department has leaked out and the result is sufficent to justify the belief that President Cleveland is meditating seriously the possibility of hostilities between Spain and the United States in the near future.

Whether the dispatch is due to a desire to recognize the Cubans as belligerents, or an intention of being in a position to enforce the Mora claim is nncertain, but it cannot be denied that the'state and navy departments have been unusually active in the last few weeks. Certain branches of the navy department are now devoting their attention to the Cuban matter almost exclusively.
