ED. HERALD: Having lately returned from a trip to the desert and Fossil Lake. I call the desert the great "sahara" of Oregon. This desert and lake has become famous to the scientific world, because of fossil remains of prehistoric animals that have been found which long since have become extinct. The character and variety of these animals were great, and many of them have not yet been classed. My helper on this last trip was J. W. Rinehart. We found some new and very interesting fossils, one the foot of an equine not larger than a small shetland pony, the coffin joint denoted the foot to have been quite vertical. Another is a part of a foot, it seemed to have been well sustained by a strong joint and deep grooves, I shall have the feet photographed the first opportunity. We found and brought home quite a lot of fossils and among them the bones of a beast that must have been of singular make and looks. The bones are short, very crooked, twisting and hooked, the locomotion of the animal must have been a zigzag movement or shuffle.

These fossil beds were named by Prof E. D. Cape, the "Equine beds of Oregon" because the horse excelled all other animals, in number and of two varieties, one very large and clumsy, the other medium or less, and from the organization of the small one, it must have possessed great speed. The desert in its uninhabitable position is monotonous, but it possesses an attraction and charm for the true lover of nature. In these solitudes no rivers or streams of any nature flow, but at long intervals a spring greets the weary traveler gushing forth, but it runs only a short distance and loses itself in the sands of the desert.
