"The grate trouble with the open saloon Sunday in New York," said Mr. Depew, "as compare with Sunday under European conditions is the American habit of treating. He dare not do it. So he invites 19 men, who are not thirsty and do not want to drink, and they have not the moral courage to refuse an invitation, which involves a personal courtesy. So the whole 19 line up to the bar, and with 'Here's at you' and 'Here's your health,' they drink to the man whose hospitality they are enjoying. Every one of the 19 men has got to return that hospitality before leaving the barroom that day, and then each recipient must return the 20 invitations in order to keep up his end. Let some mathematician compute what this means; I do not dare.
