PRACTICE.

The allegations in an affidavit of contest will not be held insufficient if the charges therein, taken togeth er, set forth a state of facts that warrant cancellation.

PRACTICE AND SETTLEMENT.

Settlement on a tract covered by the entry of another confers no right as against the record entryman or the U.S. A charge of abandonment against a homestead entry must fail where the entryman is residing upon the land when the notice of contest is served.
