## ANOTHER MCCOY KILLED.

Hunting, W. Va., April 3—Robert K. McCoy, a relative of the McCoy's who some years ago were prominent throughout the country through the celebrated McCoy-Hatfield feud, moved to this county about two months ago from up the Big Sandy valley. He was here Wednesday and left at a late hour on horseback for his home. Yesterday his horse was found 15 miles south of this city grazing along side the road, and the saddle, blanket and the sides of the horse were wet with blood.

Squire Swayne and others living in the vicinity, near where the horse was found, heard shouts, and the supposition is that McCoy was assassinated, and his body thrown into the creek, as tracks and blood were found leading to the creek today. Bloodhounds will be secured to follow up the trail of the supposed assassins. The Hatfield-McCoy feud has been on the quietscent for nearly two years, and the murder of McCoy cannot, as yet, be connected with the old time hostilities in Logan county, which extended over a dozen years and cost more than a score of lives.
