

LETTER TO CARLISLE.

Governor Altgeld Replies to the Chicago Speech.

"A year ago Cleveland sent for his former law partner and close friend, and through him Cleveland and Carlisle made a secret contract with another friend, who was a former client of Cleveland's, by which that friend and his associate speculators were enabled to make nine or ten millions out of the government in a few weeks on a small bond transaction. And the reason given for this extraordinary and even criminal procedure was that the speculators and sharks of Wall street had agreed to protect the government against the gold raids until the following November, and when the month of November arrived these speculators withdrew their protection, and then the government proceeded to issue another hundred millions of bonds, thus increasing the burdens of our people. Now Carlisle might have expatiated on this, and pointed out to the American people the lofty character of the statesman involved in these transactions, for, strange to say, many of our intelligent people are utterly unable to comprehend it."
