

SILVER MEN FORCE SHEER-  
IN OUT.

Indianapolis, May 26—The showing of strength made by the free silver Democrats today forced S. P. Sheerin Secretary of the Democratic National Committee, and a gold standard man, to withdraw as a candidate for delegate-at-large to the Chicago Convention.

His action met the approval of Gov. Matthews.

The free silver men have decided to demand that the entire delegation to Chicago shall be free silver men, and have issued a manifesto to that effect. The sound money will hold a mass-meeting on Thursday.

There is to be a meeting of the Democratic State Committee tomorrow. A majority of its members are for sound money and it may be that it will take some steps to help along the fight. The sound money representatives of the party are making.

It is conceded that B. F. Shively a free silver Democrat, will be nominated for Governor.

Female Aeronaut Killed.

Baltimore May 26—One of the attractions at Fairv Grove, a resort on Back River, six miles from the city, has been a female aeronaut and parachute jumper named Mrs. W. H. Hanner. This evening she made an ascension, and as she was leaving the balloon she became entangled in the ropes.

The parachute turned over and the aeronaut fell into Back River, the collapsed parachute covering her and preventing her making an effort to escape. Her body has not been recovered.
