# Money Question Chiefly Treat-

We, the democrats of the United States, in convention assembled reaffirm our allegiance to those great essential principles ef justice, and liberty upon which our institutions are founded, and which the democratic party has advocated from Jefferson's time to our ownfreedom of speech. freedom of the press, freedom of conscience, the preservation of personal rights, the equality of all citizens before the law, and the faithful observance of constitutional limitations.

During all these years the democratic party has resisted the tendency of selfish interests to the c ntralization of governmental power. and steadfastly maintained the integrity of the dual scheme of government as established by the founders of this republic of repubings, the great principle of local self-government has found its best expression in the maintenance of the rights of states and its assertion issue notes to circulate as money be of the necessity of confining the taken from the national banks, and general government to the exercise that all paper money shall be is of the powers granted by the consti tution of the United States. upon the silver dollar unit. We declare that the act of 1873, demonetizing silver without the knowledge or approval of the American people, has resulted in the appreciation of gold and a corresponding fall in the price of commodities produced by the people, a



heavy increase in the burden of taxation, and of all debts, public and private, the enrichment of the money miding classes at home and abroad, prestration of industry and impoverishment of the people.

We are unalterably opposed to monometalism, which has locked fast the prosperity of an industrial people in the paralysis of hard times. Gold monometalism is a British policy, and its adoption has brought other nations into financial un-American, but anti-American, For President William Jenning and can be fastened on the United spirit and love of liberty which proclaimed our political independence the Revolution.

> We demand the free and unlimited coinage of both gold and silver at the present legal ratio of 16 to 1. without waiting for the aid or consent of any other nation. We demand that the standard silver dollar shall be full legal tender equally with gold for oll debts, public and private, and we favor such legislation as will prevent for the future the demonetication of any kind of legal-tender money by private con-
