## Speed Program.

Following is the program that will be pulled off during the Fair, commencing September 30.

### FIRST DAY.

One-fourth mile dash, free for all \$100.

One-fourth mile dash for Harney county saddle horses that never run for public money, vacqueros to ride with vacqueros saddles. Jockeys barred \$50.

### SECOND DAY.

Three eighths mile dash, free for all \$125.

600 yard dash for Harney county saddle horses that never won first money \$50.

### THIRD DAY.

Gentleman's Road Race, trotters and pacers for Harney county horses, heats 2 in 3, 4 miles \$100.

### FOURTH DAY.

Three-eighths mile and repeat free for all \$150.

### FIFTH DAY.

Three and one-half furloughs, free for all \$125.

Indian race jades and reverse \$10.

### SIXTH DAY.

One-half mile dash free for all \$150.

One-fourth mile dash for Harney county saddle horses that never won public money riders to ride bareback without being strapped or tied on \$20.

One-fourth mile dash for Harney county ponies not to weigh over 800 pounds and to be ridden by boys under 15, \$30.

### CONDITIONS GOVERNING RACES.

Entrance fee 10 per cent of purse to enter 3 to start. Money, divided 70 and 30 per cent. Entry must be recorded by 8 o'clock p.m. in the day preceding the race, starting worn by rider—no horse being allowed to start without color.

The board of directors reserve the right to alter, amend or postpone any or all races, should they for any reason deem it expedient to do so.

Pacific Jockey Club rules govern all races.
