Gentleman's Road Race, trotters and pacers for Harney county horses, heats 2 in 3, 1/4 miles \$100

FOURTH DAY.
Three-eighths mile and repeat free for all \$150.

FIFTH DAY.
Three and one-half furlongs, free for all \$125.
Indian race hurdles and reverse \$10.

SIXTH DAY.
One-half mile dash free for all \$150.

One-fourth mile dash for Harney county saddle horses that never won public money riders to ride bareback without being strapped or tied on \$50.

One-fourth mile dash for Harney county ponies not to weigh over 800 pounds and to be ridden by boys under 15, \$30.

CONDITIONS GOVERNING RACES.
