

#### State and Congressional Conventions.

The Republican congressional and state conventions convened in Portland, Tuesday and Wednesday of this week. The delegates elected at a meeting of the bolters held in Burns on March 26, were admitted to seats, they having represented themselves as being elected at the regular county convention. This is not surprising, as men who would and did forge another's name to gain their purpose in the first place, would not hesitate to do anything to carry out a permediated string of deceptive methods to further gain their baseless ends. Their obtaining seats in the state and congressional conventions does not decide the right or wrong of the question in dispute from this county, the main question considered by the committee was the one, "How are you going to vote if seated?" The men that they could handle were easily discernible among those attending from this county, hence their unopposed entry into seats bought by falsehoods and deceit. ### A DISGRACEFUL FRAUD REPUBLICAN PRIMARIES

#### Bold Forgery Committed to Deceive the Public.

It is now a well-known fact that Mr. Jos. Robertson's name (as Secretary of the Republican Central Committee) was FORGED to the call issued by A. W. Gowan and other members of the "Ring," announcing republican primary elections of the county on March 22, and "special convention" on March 26, 1902.

This most outrageous imposition upon an honest and highly respected citizen who had placed his proxy in his hands with confidence that it would be used in the best interests of his party at the meeting of our Central Committee, for which occasion alone, the proxy was given, is an act which is already bringing upon its perpetrator the united condemnation of every republican voter of the county, who is outside of the "Ring."

The ex-State Senator, evidently argues that "desperate cases, require desperate remedies." In his extreme eagerness to get some kind of pro-losing, anti-Moody delegation elected in some kind of way, by some kind of meeting, the fellow has without any authority from Mr. Robertson, used his name to mislead republican voters of the county.

From our knowledge of Mr. Robertson's character, civilly as a man, and politically as a republican, we feel safe in asserting that he would lend the use of his name to no scheme which has for its object such ends as has this specious call for a "special convention" on the 26th inst.

As we have heretofore stated, we do not think the election of delegates by a Central Committee quite the proper thing, notwithstanding the fact that it is of frequent occurrence within our state, and that such delegations have NEVER been denied a seat in our state convention, but when a majority of our Central Committee has deemed it proper, and in the best interests of our party within our county, it affords no valid excuse for any one to resort to falsehood and fraud to put into execution plans to disrupt the party.

The article relating to the action of our Central Committee at its recent meeting, was simply a tissue of silly, malicious falsehood, published with evident intent to deceive and mislead honest republicans everywhere, and this much of its purpose has to some extent been accomplished, but when facts become known, the "Ring" will have to take its medicine as usual.

Two of the five names signed to the call in the News for the "pushers" primaries and convention have been denounced as forgeries. Yet that religious sheet stops to say in the same breath something about "principle in politics."
