Continued from First page require 80,000 pounds of sugar during a year. At the Island ranch near Burns, there is one hay field enclosed by 24 miles of fence.

A typical ranch is the Agency ranch, having 1440 acres of valley land enclosed. Fifteen men are employed and this summer about 1500 tons of hay will be put into the stack. Six mowing machines were busy when the Democrat man was a guest at the ranch. Part of the ranch buildings were once used as United States agency buildings. The ranch has a large boarding house, four or five dwellings, large blacksmith and machine shops, with water power, huge barns and corrals. One of the outside pastures is enclosed by nine miles of fencing. In the spring 900 calves are weaned in the immense shelter shed. In Indian days the blacksmith shop building was the government school house for the small red men and red women. The bell now in use on the ranch dining hall was formerly used on the school house to call to the pathway of knowledge the young aborigines. On this splendid ranch everything is kept as neat as wax, the hours are regular, meals generous and well cooked and the officers and employes are industrious and contented. The ranch management is directed by Foreman Bart Cronin and his estimable wife.

The Pacific Livestock Company is busy on a gigantic scale and is an important factor in Eastern Oregon industrial life.

Continued from First page: same day two trainloads of cattle were shipped from Eastern Oregon—one from Echo and one from Ontario—for Omaha and Kansas City. The cattle grown on the Oregon range are shipped a thousand miles to the Eastern packing-houses, and the beefs then shipped back to Oregon to compete with that slaughtered locally. Adequate stockparks and packing-houses in Portland would govern all this trade, with all the margin of a double freight rate to protect them from Eastern competition. The business would be handled at home, where it belongs, and Portland would reap all the advantage from being the seat of a great meat-packing industry. And no other city in the country is so favorably situated for such an industry on a large scale.
