The second Oregon pension to be issued under the Indian War Veteran bill of June 27th last, is to Maxwell Ramsby, of this city, says The Dalles Chronicle. This claim has been pushed by Representative Moody to a successful issue. Ramsby, who is now 81 years old, served as second lieutenant in Captain P. Hugh's company, of Colonel Gilliam's regiment of Oregon volunteers, from April 18 to July 1, 1848, during the latter part of the Cayuse War.
