#### Party Is Working From Huntington Towards Prineville.

Ontario, June 23 .- A party of Government surveyors, with C. H. Semper in charge, pitched camp in the western part of Ontario today. They are carrying out a line of levels which was begun about three years ago at Portland, extending by The Dalles, Pendleton, LaGrande and down to Huntington. Mr. Semper's party began their work in Huntirgton. From Ontario they follow the stage route, via Vale, Burns and thence to Prineville and back to The Dalles. Their work is to ascertain the elevations of the country and to prepare topographic maps of the route, establish elevation markers, etc., and is more evidence that the Government means to reclaim much of this sagebrush land and transform it into fertile farming lands by supplying water.
