In shape and size, says Good Words, some are flattened, globular masses of small size, others are great tree-like growths, several feet round; others wide, deep cups, and others lit tle lacework tubes of the finest spure glass. Some are tough and horny, and | Work at your home. The greatest number of sponges, however, grow in water from 500 to 1,000 fathoms in depile.

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
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
