

Magone, Camp Lick on agenda

JOHN DAY – A Malheur National Forest open house next week will offer information about two forest restoration projects, Magone and Camp Lick.

The event will be from 6 to 8 p.m. Tuesday, Feb. 24, at the Grant County Regional Airport.

Both projects are north of John Day on the Blue Mountain Ranger District.

The Magone Project focuses on the Grub Creek and East Fork Beech Creek subwatersheds.

The purpose is to restore forest health by making the forest structure, vegetation, and riparian areas more resilient to natural disturbances such as wildfire.

The project is expected to include silviculture and fuels treatments, riparian restoration, range improvements, recreation site work, and road system changes.

The next step for Magone is a formal environmental review.

To begin that, the agency is seeking stakeholder comments that will help determine alternatives and identify issues for analysis.

Circuit Court

CANYON CITY – The Grant County Circuit Court reported the following fines and judgments:

- Sarah Fayette Derosier, 26, pleaded guilty to driving under the influence of intoxicants. She was sentenced to jail for five days, supervised probation for 24 months and 120 hours community service, and fined \$1,500. Her driver's license was suspended for three years. She pleaded guilty to driving uninsured, and was fined \$260. The court dismissed counts for violation driving while suspended or revoked, and driver failure to report an accident.
