The analysis area includes six livestock grazing allotments; Donaldson, Deer Creek, Indian Ridge, Hamilton, King On/Off, and Highway. This project proposal is to continue livestock grazing within the North Finger Complex boundaries. The North Finger Complex is located in Grant County approximately 22 miles northwest of the town of John Day, Oregon (Map 1). The Complex encompasses approximately 20,000 acres and is located within the Long Creek, Lower North Fork John Day River, and Cottonwood Creek watersheds.

The legal description for the project planning area is (township, range, sections):

- Township 10 South, Range 28 East, sections 10-15,
- T. 10 S., R. 29 E., sec. 7-9, 18-14, 19-24;

- T. 12 S., R. 28 E., sec. 1-3 Willamette Meridian.

The Blue Mountain Ranger District proposes to continue authorization of livestock grazing on allotments within the North Finger Complex using adaptive management strategies designed to meet the Malheur National Forest Land and Resource Management Plan standards and guidelines. Elements involved with the proposed action include: pasture grazing rotation strategies implemented so that vegetation in each pasture is allowed to mature and set seed, construction of wildlife friendly fence better manage riparian habitats in the Donaldson allotment, and installing water developments to provide off-site livestock water in the Donaldson, Hamilton, King, and Indian Ridge allotments.


