Grant County's varied terrain – from grassy meadows to subalpine heights – offers nonstop delight for wildflower enthusiasts. Starting in early spring and continuing into fall, native plants leaf out and bloom.

Visitors can't miss the waves of bright yellow Oregon sunshine growing on open slopes, and rambling wild rose bushes in the glens

and along the roadways. Those who venture into the woods are apt to encounter delicate columbines and lilies, while penstemon and other water-loving species thrive along the creeks and in damp rock crevices.

So pack up your wildflower guide and a camera, and enjoy the floral side of Grant County!

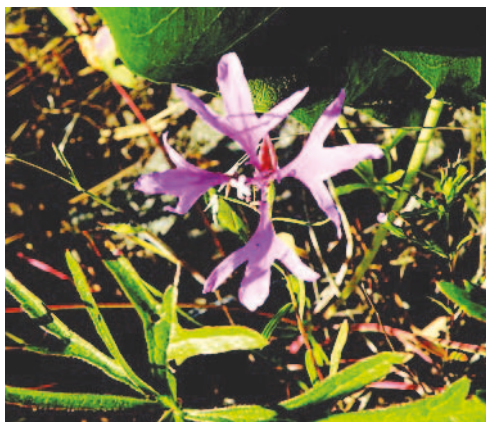
