

SolWest menu has plenty for children, adults

Longtime leader Barker will offer kids' sessions

LA GRANDE – Jennifer Barker will present a couple of children's workshops on Saturday, June 27, during the 17th annual SolWest Fair in La Grande.

She will offer two workshops, one on renewable energy for children ages 7-11, and a story hour for children ages 3-8. Both workshops will focus on alternative energy and the environment.

Barker was the long-time executive director for EO Renew and coordinated the Sol-West Fair for 15 years when its home was in John Day. She was also in charge of the John Day Solar Tour as well as energy presentations for children of all ages.

Barker's workshop is just one of many at this year's Sol-West Fair, which will run June 26-28 at the Union County Fairgrounds.

This is the fair's second year in La Grande, after the shift in sponsorship from EO Renew to Oregon Rural Action. Organizers say most of the traditions of the fair are retained while the scope of activ-

ities has been broadened.

SolWest's workshop topics include the basics of going solar, building with cob, training cart goats, electric cars and off-grid food storage. The fair will also offer four classes that qualify for Continuing Education Credits from Oregon Department of Energy. Classes are open to anyone attending the fair and a full list of workshops can be found on the SolWest website.

Volunteers have also organized fun and engaging children's activities to compliment Barker's workshops. On Sunday, June 28, the La Grande Parks and Recreation Department will host a Renewable Family Fun Day from 11 a.m.-2 p.m. Activities will include recycled crafts, fuel-cell cars, and learning how windmills work.

Fair tickets can be purchased online at www.oregonrural.org/solwest or at the gate. Weekend passes are \$15 for adults, \$10 for children and \$30 for a family. Presale discounts will be offered for weekend passes until June 20. Day passes will also be available at the gate.
