South Fork Complex Fire Reforestation Project 30-Day Notice and Scoping Period

The Blue Mountain Ranger District of the Malheur National Forest would like to invite the public to participate in planning for the South Fork Complex Fire Reforestation Project. We are preparing a Categorical Exclusion (CE)/Decision Memo and are asking for public scoping comments on the proposed action. The Malheur National Forest is proposing to revegetate approximately 1,900 acres of stand-replacement fire patches within the South Fork Complex Fire that burned in 2014. These actions are proposed within the South Fork Complex Fire boundary, on the Blue Mountain Ranger District approximately 22 miles southwest of John Day in Grant County, Oregon. 
