Management of the West
Fork Fire was transferred
back to the Malheur Nation-
al Forest effective July 13 .
As conditions allow, fire
crews will continue to mop
up along the fire lines and
patrol the area. Crews have
completed a line around the
northern and western perim-
eter, as well as most of the
eastern perimeter.
At present the fire pos-
es no immediate threat, but
as seasonal weather returns
and unburned fuels between
the fire and the containment
lines dry, the fire will contin-
ue to be monitored closely.
