Notice of Preliminary Determination for Water Right Transfer T-11865

T-11865 filed by Michael Kilpatrick, PO Box A, Mt. Vernon, 97865, proposes a change in place of use and points of diversion under Certificates 25439 and 82401. Certificate 25439 allows the use of 1/40th of one cfs per acre irrigated to June 1 and 1/80th of one cfs per acre thereafter; Certificate 82401 allows the use of 0.134 cfs, both from diversions on Fall Creek, located within Sec. 14, T13S, R30E, WM, for irrigation in Sects. 14 and 15. The applicant proposes to change the point of diversion for both rights to within Sec. 14. The Water Resources Department has concluded that the proposed transfer appears to be consistent with the requirements of ORS Chapter 540, OAR 690-380-2110 and 690-380-5000.

Any person may file, jointly or severally, a protest or standing statement within 30 days after the last date of newspaper publication of this notice, 09/16/2015. Call (503) 986-0807 to obtain additional information or a protest form. If no protests are filed, the Department will issue a final order consistent with the preliminary determination.

Summit Creek Landscape Restoration
Scoping Period Extended

The Prairie City Ranger District of the Malheur National Forest is extending the scoping period an additional 14 days for the Summit Creek Landscape Restoration Project. The purpose of this scoping period is to provide the public time in which to review and address additional information which was not provided in the initial scoping document. This extended scoping period is a designated opportunity for public comment. Previous comments received are part of the project record. Whether you have yet to make a comment or you have additional comments based on the additional information, your comments will be accepted and considered for alternative development until October 2, 2015.

The proposed action includes silviculture treatments, prescribed burning, road activities, recreation opportunity improvements, riparian measures, and restoration activities within the approximately 38,000-acre project planning area. The purpose of this project is to restore forest resiliency by re-establishing and restoring forest structure and pattern, vegetation composition and diversity, and riparian communities to conditions that are more resilient to natural disturbance processes. These actions are proposed on national forest lands located approximately 20 miles southeast of Prairie City, Oregon, in eastern Grant County. The project area is located within the Prairie City Ranger District and is bounded by the Strawberry Wilderness to the north, the recently analyzed Elk 16 Landscape Restoration Project to the east, Logan Valley to the west, and the District boundary to the south. County Highway 62 and Forest Service road 16 pass through the project area. The Summit Creek Landscape Restoration Project is within all or parts of the following townships and ranges: T15S, R35E; T16S, R35E; T16S, R34E; T16S, R33E; T17S, R34E; and, T17S, R33.2E, Willamette Meridian.

1. Reference is made to that certain deed of trust (the “Trust Deed”) dated **May 12, 2003**, executed and delivered by **Brian R. ALSO, THE FOLLOWING DESCRIBED TRACT OF LAND: BEGINNING AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SAID LOT 28; THENCE S14°09’W, ALONG THE EAST LINE OF LOTS 28 AND 25, 75.0 FEET TO A POINT, SAID POINT BEING ON THE EAST LINE OF SAID LOT 25; THENCE S75°51’E, TO THE CENTER OF CANYON CREEK; THENCE NORTHEAST-ERLY, ALONG SAID CENTER LINE, TO A POINT WHICH IS S75°51’E OF THE POINT OF BEGINNING. No action has been instituted to recover the obligation, or any part thereof, now remaining secured by the Trust Deed or, if such action has been instituted, such action has been dismissed except as permitted by ORS 86.752(7).

The default for which the foreclosure is made is the Grant-or’s failure to pay when due the following sums: monthly payments in full owed under the Note beginning August 1, 2014, and each month thereafter; late charges in the amount of \$189.53 as of July 24, 2015, plus additional late charges accruing thereafter; and expenses, costs, trustee fees, and attorneys’ fees.

2. By reason of said default, the Beneficiary has declared all sums owing on the obligation secured by the Trust Deed immediately due and payable which sums are as follows: (a) the principal amount of \$48,215.08 as of July 24, 2015, (b) accrued interest of \$2,754.82 as of July 24, 2015, and interest accruing thereafter on the principal amount at the rate set forth in the Note, until fully paid, (c) escrow/ impound overdraft in the amount of \$923.01 as of July 24, 2015, plus any late charges accruing thereafter and any other expenses or fees owed under the Note or Trust Deed, (d) amounts that Beneficiary has paid on or may hereinafter pay to protect the lien, including by way of illustration, but not limitation, taxes, assessments, interest on prior liens, and insurance premiums, and (e) expenses, costs, and attorneys’ and trustee fees incurred by the Beneficiary in foreclosure, including the cost of a trustee’s sale guarantee and any other environmental or appraisal report.
