

The project proposes to treat almost 27,000 acres of vegetation with commercial and non-commercial treatments. Landscape scale fuel treatments are also proposed across 38,595 acres. Forest road activities would include closing, seasonal closing, decommissioning and opening roads. Additionally, typical road maintenance activities designed to meet Malheur Forest Plan standards and guidelines would be performed.
