

"We went to Adrian shorthanded," said head coach Penny Black. Sarah Ennis took the reins, leading the Panthers into battle.


"Sarah did an outstanding job holding the team together in a hard-fought game against the Lady Lopes, who had 20 seated on their bench," Black said.

The 16 wrestlers on the team are putting their strength, endurance and form to the test.


