In Accordance with OAR 695-045-0185 and ORS 271.735. OWEB Land Acquisition Grant Program, concerning approximately 6800 acres in the vicinity of Mitchell, Grant Application No. 216-9902. The Oregon Watershed Enhancement Board (OWEB) is a state agency that provides grants to help Oregonians take care of local streams, rivers, wetlands, and natural areas.

OWEB is considering a grant of funds to Blue Mountains Conservancy for the purpose of purchasing certain property rights on approximately 6800 acres in the vicinity of Mitchell, in Wheeler County, under Grant Application No. 216-9902. OWEB will hold a conservation easement, or third party rights of enforcement in a conservation easement, if the property rights are purchased with OWEB funds.

Oregon Water Resources Department in support of Grant County, the City of Canyon City and the City of John Day has applied for Hazard Mitigation Grant Program funding from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to fund the Canyon Creek Watershed Stream Gaging Project located in the Canyon Creek watershed and includes two stream gaging sites; 1) Vance Creek on Hwy. 395 and, 2) Canyon Creek at Bridge No. 12C20 (a double concrete box culvert), Grant County Road #65. Both selected stream gaging locations were previously occupied by United States Geological Survey stream gages. Pursuant to 44 CFR Part 9.12, FEMA gives early notice under Executive Order (EO) 11988, Floodplain Management and EO 11990, Wetland Protection; since this action is located in or affects the floodplain or may affect wetlands.

The project sites are located in or affect the floodplain of Vance Creek and Canyon Creek. The purpose of the project is to collect near real time stream level data that can provide advance notice of impending flood conditions on Canyon Creek. Warnings for flooding are issued by the National Weather Service in Pendleton, Oregon, and disseminated on NOAA Weather Radio, local media and the county's mass notification system. The proposed action includes: Installation of two stream gages that will measure water levels using non-contact radar sensors, control equipment and satellite communications. The type of water level sensor used is mounted above the stream and bounces a radar signal off the water surface to determine the water level. No ground disturbance is associated with this type of water level sensor installation.

Alternatives were considered using the existing stream gage near the City of Canyon City, only, but that stream gaging site provides little advance warning of impending flooding to the community. Comments concerning the proposed action will be accepted from the affected public; local, state and federal agencies; and other interested parties in order to consider and evaluate alternatives and the environmental impacts of the proposed action. Comments should be made in writing, sent to the point of contact listed below, and postmarked (or e-mailed) within 15 days of posting of this notice.

Given the nature of the proposed action, if no public comments are received, no further public notice will be conducted for this project.
